

iPhoto SlideShow DVD Directions




Create an album for your selected photos by:

- Uploading photos from your camera
- Dragging photos from the library to this album folder
- Dragging photos to this folder from a photo CD or flashdrive

Put them in the order you would like them played.

OPTIONAL:

To create title pictures, open **PowerPoint** and create a text slide

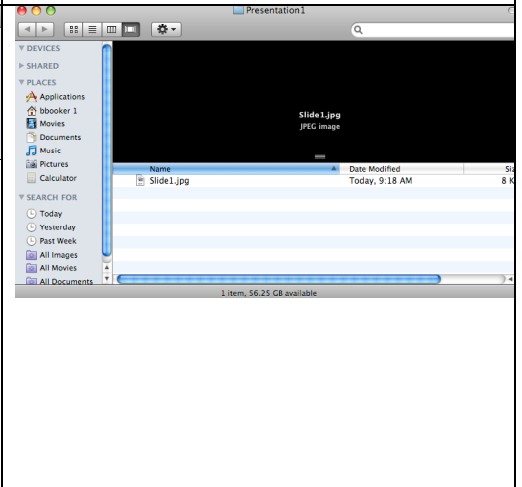
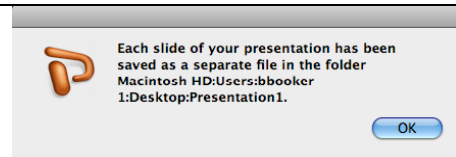
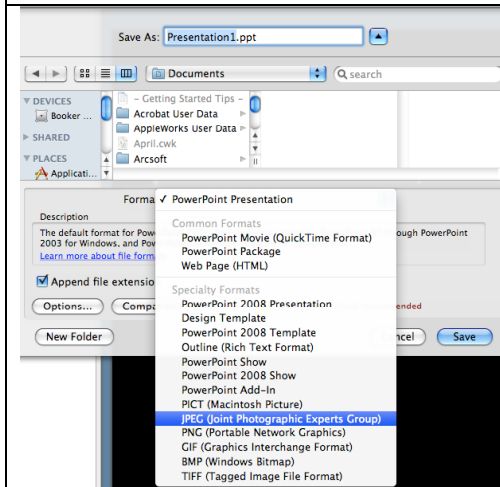

When completed, **File/Save As:**

Change the Format to JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) and select the location in which to save. It will save to a folder. *(If you forgot where you saved it, it will go to your documents folder.)*

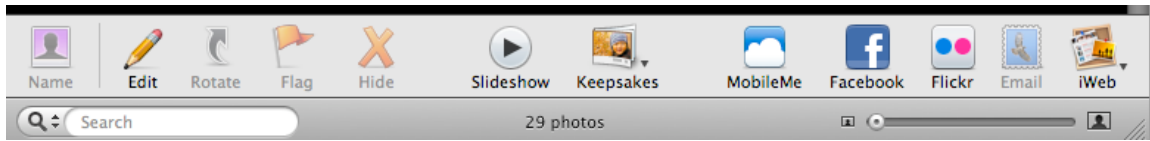
You will see the following screen:

To use a slide in your slideshow, open the folder in which the jpg was created and drag this file to your iPhoto album. It will automatically upload. Put this slide in the proper order for your presentation.



Creating the SlideShow

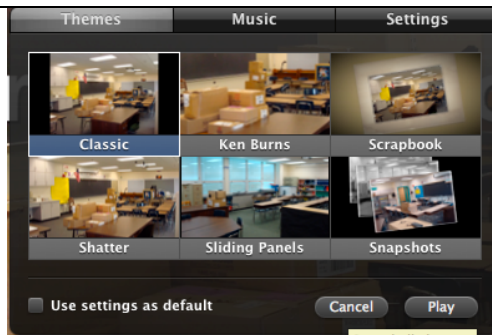
Click on **Slideshow** at the bottom



If you need to make adjustments to your selections, drag your mouse over the bottom center area to activate the following menu:

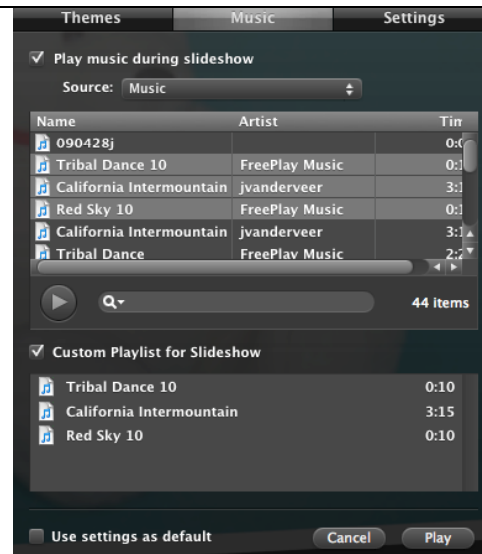


Choose your **Theme**.



Choose your **Music**.

To use music from iTunes or GarageBand, select it as your Source.
Click on Custom Playlist for SlideShow and drag in music in the order you would like played.
(Drag songs to the left and then drag down to the bottom sections.)



If desired, make setting adjustments such as **slide length**, loop presentation, etc...

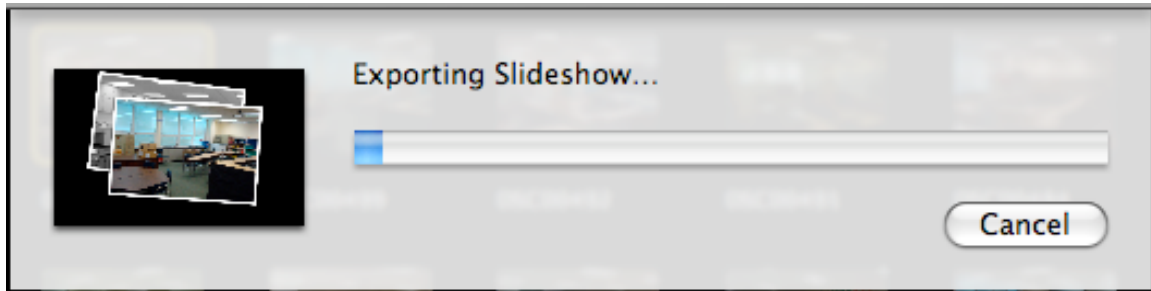
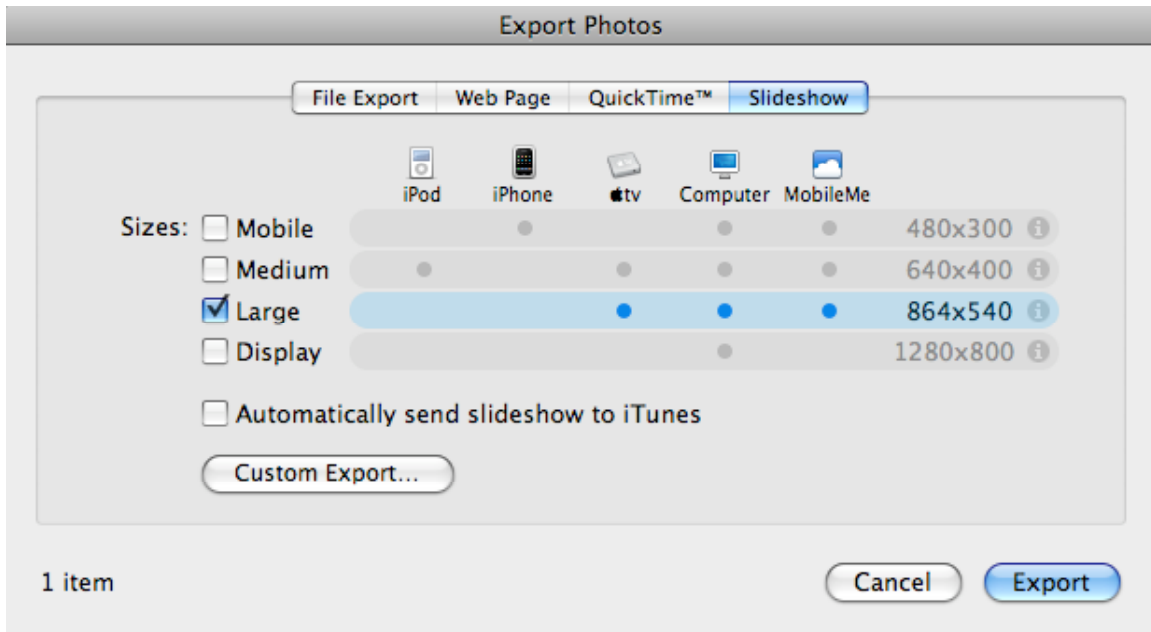


File/Export/SlideShow

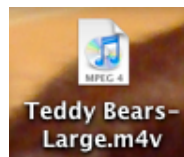
Choose **Large**

Unclick Automatically send slideshow to iTunes

Click **Export**



Note that this process will take some time. When complete, the m4v file will be saved in the designated location.



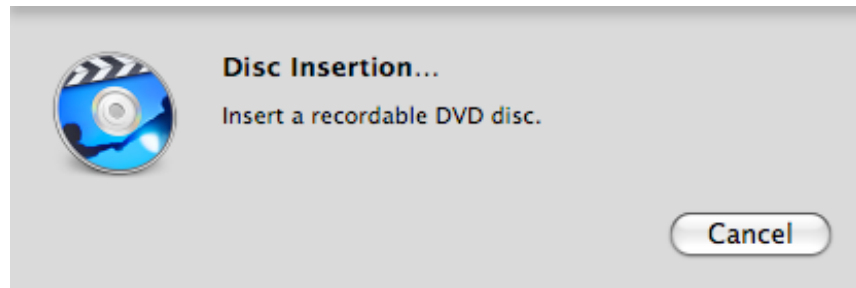
Burning the DVD

Open **iDVD**.

File/One Step DVD from Movie (*Choose this feature since you do not need to use themes and chapters*)

Select your saved **movie**

It will prompt you **to insert a DVD**



The first DVD will take some time to create. You will receive a prompt to insert subsequent DVD's. The burning of these DVD's will go quickly.
